Announcing our newest publication Marriage Registers Granville County, North Carolina 1866 – 1894

Extracted marriage records of Granville County, North Carolina 1866 through 1894. Section one, 1866-1867, is Cohabitation marriage records of freed slaves immediately after the Civil War. Section two is marriages from certificates filed in 1869 through 1894 in the Register of Deeds Office in Oxford, North Carolina. Book includes an Index of all names of Grooms and Brides

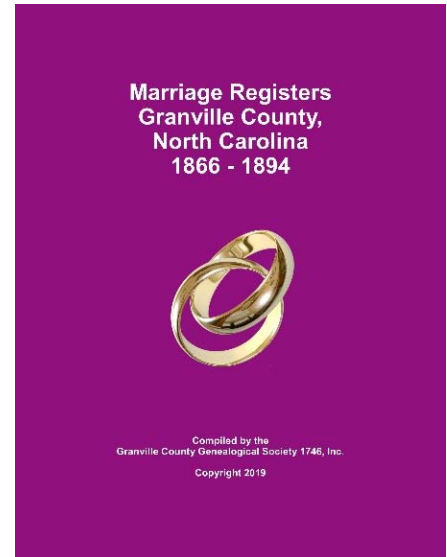

The marriage records are listed in two sections as follows:

Section One Lists the Cohabitation records from the registration of freed slaves immediately after the Civil War. The abolition of slavery raised the question of freed men's marriages. In 1866, the North Carolina General Assembly passed "An Act Concerning Negroes and Persons of Color or of Mixed Blood." Those persons who wished to register their pre-Emancipation marriages were required to appear before the clerk of the county court or a justice of the peace to acknowledge their marital status. These acknowledgements were to be recorded and regarded as proof that a marriage had, indeed, existed. These surviving records do not represent all slave marriages, by any means. Individuals registering their cohabitation were issued a Certificate of Marriage. These registrations were recorded during 1866 and 1867. Some of these people who registered lived in present day Vance County, since that county was formed in 1881 from the larger Granville County.

Section Two Lists the information extracted from marriage indexes and marriage certificates on file in the Register of Deeds Office in the Granville County Courthouse in Oxford, North Carolina for the years 1869 through 1894. This list was abstracted to help save the brittle papers from being handled by patrons and a copy of these certificates are in the Richard Thornton Library. Some of the original marriage certificates are missing from the files and cannot be located.

From the President—

“HAPPY 25TH ANNIVERSARY”

Here we are remembering what we have accomplished over the years. We covered the first six years in the last Journal and we will cover the next six years this time.

First we are really excited having a new book for sale, as you can see on the previous page. This book covers the cohabitation of the black race that was not recognized in North Carolina until 1866. These marriages, cover forty plus years living as man and wife. The couples had to appear before the Clerk of Court or a Justice of the Peace and tell how many years they had been together. They were given a paper with this written on it and signed by the Clerk of Court or the JP. The book also has 26 years of Granville County marriages of all races. This book is an excellent research tool if your ancestors lived in Granville County.

Looking back we published the first volume of our Cemetery Book series and it was a big success.

We started working on the Granville County Heritage Book. There was a lot of interest at the beginning but it dwindled down to one person before it was finished. Working with Walsworth Publishing Company, I was able to get copies of other county Heritage books for our library. The money from this project went to honor over one hundred and fifty military service men and women from Granville County.

Continuing our cemetery project we catalogued more cemeteries and helped one Boy Scout get his Eagle Scout award with his work on one of his family cemeteries.

A second volume of our cemetery book was published and was a big success.

Cataloguing of cemeteries is keeping us busy. A third volume of our cemetery books was published in December 2006. I am sure Bonnie Breedlove's fingers are getting tired

as she has served as Editor of the Journal and also got each cemetery book ready for the printer. Much to our surprise she resigned as editor of the Journal after ten years. Thank you Bonnie.

Next the Society voted and purchased 71 reels of microfilm of Loose Estate Records for Granville County. The Society also contributed WPA Cemetery records of Franklin, Vance, Nash, Warren, and Person Counties for the NC Room.

The NC Room outgrew its space and was moved to a larger space in another section of the library. The room had a lot of growing pains for a while and the library director made room in another section of the library for the NC Room.

Our webmaster Allen Dew is updating and adding burials to the cemeteries on Cemetery Census. So far he has 430 cemeteries listed for Granville County. If you have one that needs to be added send him the name/names with dates, name of cemetery, and a picture of the cemetery and tombstones.

If you are interested in starting your family research please consider joining our Society. You can go online to GCGS.ORG for an application and membership information. Also you can pay for your membership with your credit card or PayPal. You will receive four Journals and the messenger each year. Our meetings are held the first Thursday of each month except July when we take a vacation. The books that we have for sale are listed on the website. The Society members are all willing to help you. And we have a North Carolina Room at the Thornton Library with tons of information to help you uncover your family information. Also our Journals are searchable on-line.

The Mitchells and Lanes in Granville County

My mother was Ruth Mitchell Lane. Daughter of Mary "Mamie" Denisha Harrison Mitchell and Alonzo Mitchell, she was born in 1900 in Granville County. Her family members were longtime Granville County people. Granddaddy Alonzo Mitchell (better known as Lonnie) lived in the Grove Hill Community. The Grove Hill Community is located about three miles east of the Wilton Community. Wilton is where the school, post office, blacksmith and a doctor's office were located in later years. It is at the intersection of Highway 96 and Highway 56. Alonzo and his two brothers, Alphonso and Erastus, were all landowners in the community. Their land joined each other's and combined; there were about 400 acres between the three farms.

Granddaddy Mitchell helped with the building of Grove Hill United Methodist Church in 1890-91, and I have been told that the podium was built by him. The Mitchell brothers' homes were all within sight of the church.

There was a school in the Grove Hill Community also. My aunts were teachers there and taught the younger students. This would have been in the 1920s. Granddaddy Mitchell was a tobacco grower and had a large amount of acreage. His brothers were also tobacco farmers. Granddaddy started a tobacco factory that produced plug and snuff, and he ran it for many years.

My Daddy's father, Benjamin Franklin Lane, was a Nash County native. Granddaddy Mitchell got word that Granddaddy Lane was a tobacco salesman and recruited him to come to work in Granville County selling his tobacco products. So he moved to Granville County and built the Lane residence on Grove Hill Church Road some time during the Civil War, prior to 1868.

Granddaddy Lane and his wife, Victoria Horner Lane, lived next door to the Mitchells and the tobacco factory. The Lanes had six children and their youngest son, Walter Benjamin Lane, started courting Lonnie Mitchell's daughter, Ruth Bryan Mitchell. Ruth and Walter married in 1916. Six children were born to them. Three of the children lived to be adults: these were Barbara, Frank, and Ralph.

In my growing up in the Grove Hill and Wilton communities, we had a productive and fun time. We stayed busy on the farm working the tobacco, cotton, corn and hay crops for the cows and mules. We went to church regularly, and we were very active there. We went to school in Wilton. During the busy crop season, we would go to Oxford or Franklinton once or twice a month for food or farm supplies.

Walter Blacknall was a black man who worked on the farm with us. He was a very knowledgeable and very caring man. He lived on the farm in a house with his wife Lucy. He and I were real close, and I spent a lot of time with him. I have many fond memories of Walter.

One memory that I have is that Walter would work Monday through Friday and until noon on Saturday. He

would then wash and clean himself (in the summer we would do this in the creek) and then Walter would walk the three miles to Wilton and spend all afternoon there visiting with his family and friends. Walter would usually buy a can of Spam, a loaf of bread and a Pepsi for his Saturday supper. Walter would walk back to the farm that night. Sunday morning, he would rise early and cook his Sunday meal of a chicken and vegetables like collards or corn or something grown from his garden. He then went to his church on the Cannady Mill Road.

During tobacco curing season, Walter and I stayed at the barns and kept the fires burning to cure the tobacco. Many nights were sleepless ones because Walter would tell ghost stories and talk about his imaginary boys, Johnny and Willie. Walter said that Johnny was an airplane pilot and he traveled everywhere. Anytime a plane flew over, Walter would say Johnny was flying it. Walter told me that Willie was a train engineer and any time we heard a train whistle, he would say "That's Willie passing through!"

Walter taught me a poem before I started school that I still remember. It goes as follows:

"Drive your nails straight, boys, hit it on the head.
Strike with all your might, boys, while the iron is 'red.
When you have work to do, boys, do it with a will.
Standin' at the foot, boys, gazing at the sky.
How can you get up, boys, if you never try."

We had many good years together and worked to keep the farm chores in order. I can truthfully say that I enjoyed every minute of it.

After finishing high school at Wilton, I married Patsy Victoria Brummitt who lived about five miles away in the Gray Rock Community. We moved to Raleigh while I attended State College. We have four children, Franklin Alonzo Jr., Robert David, Benjamin Clay and Nancy Katherine, all of whom are now grown with children of their own.

I am a very happy and proud father and grandfather. My life has been truly blessed in so many ways.

Howell Lewis
of Granville County

Howell Lewis (b. 13 Sept 1731) was the fourth son of Col. Charles Lewis of "The Byrd" and Mary Howell of Goochland Co., VA. (His first name was sometimes misspelled as Howel).

Howell Lewis married Mary Isabella Willis, daughter of Col. Henry Willis and Mildred Lewis Howell Brown, of Fredericksburg, VA. Howell and Mary Isabella Lewis had 10 children, It is believed that all their children were born in Granville Co., NC.

The 10 children of Howell and Mary Isabella Lewis were Howell, Mildred, Mary, Isabella, Elizabeth, Anne, Frances, Willis, Jane and Charles.

Howell Lewis moved his family to North Carolina between 1756 and 1760, probably in early 1757. On November 30, 1756 Howell Lewis of Goochland County, Virginia, purchased 2,056 acres along Grassy Creek in Granville County, province of North Carolina. In 1760, Howell Lewis of Granville County,

Province of North Carolina, received a Land Grant for land in Granville County. The home where Howell Lewis lived was known as "Elmwood."

The Lewis family was Presbyterian by faith. Howell Lewis is listed as one of the organizers of the Grassy Creek Presbyterian Church. He later was one of its Trustees.

Howell Lewis and his family were active in the development of the United States of America. He is listed as a Captain in the North Carolina Militia in 1760-61. He is listed in the DAR Patriot Index. In the 1790 census, Howell Lewis and also Howell Lewis, Jr. are listed as living in the Abraham's Plains District of Granville County.

Most of Howell and Isabella Lewis' children remained in Granville County after getting married. Howell Lewis, Jr. married Elizabeth Coleman; Mary married Charles Lewis Kennon; Isabella married Swepson Jeffries; Elizabeth married William Ridley; Frances married Samuel Bugg; Willis married Mary Ann Taylor; Jane married David Hinton and Charles married Nancy Smith.

The same man married two of the daughters and moved to Georgia. Mildred married John Cobb(s) in Sept 1769 and they moved to Georgia. They had six children. Their oldest son, Howell Cobb, was Secretary of the Treasury under President James Buchanan. Mildred died in 1785 and John(s) returned to Granville County, NC to his wife's family. In February/March 1786, John Cobb married Mildred's younger sister Anne Lewis. They had one daughter, Elizabeth. John Cobb died in 1803. Anne and Elizabeth Cobb moved back to "Elmwood" in Granville County, NC. Anne married Little Joe Morton, prior to November 1813. They had no children.

In June 1809, Elizabeth Cobb married Thomas Bullock Lewis, the son of Charles Lewis and Mary Anderson. Charles Lewis was the son of Howell Lewis' older brother, Captain James Lewis and his wife Elizabeth Taylor, daughter of John Taylor and Catherine Pendleton of "Macpelah", near Townsville, NC. Mary Isabella Willis Lewis died September 5, 1813. Howell Lewis died November 26, 1813. They are said to be buried at "Elmwood", Granville County, NC.

Thomas Bullock Lewis and Elizabeth Cobb had six children: Anne, Howell, Mildred, Willis, Lucy Anne, and Charles Ridley Lewis. Anne and Howell never married. Mildred married Peterson Thorpe, Willis married Rosa Ann Crichton, Lucy Anne married Archibald D. Williams, and Charles Ridley married Eloise Harris.

Dr. Willis Lewis and his wife Rosa lived at Lewis' Station, where he practiced medicine. They had nine children: Thomas Crichton, who died as a child; Mildred married Donald Dunlop; Willis E. married Sarah Ella Adams; Leonidas Howell married Sarah Chapel; Walter married Sallie Cooper; Mattie Jean married Adolphus Wortham; Frances Elizabeth married 1st) Lemuel Jordan (d. 1877) 2nd) David E. Porter (d. 1882, and 3rd) Thaddeus Rives Manning (d. 1915); Charles Archibald married Carrie Smoot and Margaret Eloise married Gregory Lyne.

Frances Elizabeth Lewis left Granville County and married Thaddeus Rives Manning in 1888. He was founder and publisher of the Henderson Gold Leaf newspaper from 1882 to 1911. They had four children: Marie, William L., J. Rives and Edward B. Manning.

William Paschall of the Land Grants and Some Descendants

William Paschall settled in a part of Granville County that is now Warren County, Smith Creek Township in the mid 1700s. After arriving in North Carolina, he petitioned 150 acres of land from the colonial government in 1744. This possibility indicates he and two of his sons were in North Carolina at that time. Later in 1749, records show Lord Granville granted him 625 acres of land in Granville County. Additional grants in 1760 and 1761 amounted to 2,597 acres for William and his sons to clear, cultivate, and build homes.

William was probably born about 1703 and married Reliance. They had the following children: Isaiah, Elisha, John, William, James, Dennis, Thomas, Sarah, Dianna, Rachel, Ruth, and Reliance. Records show William deeded to seven of his sons most of the land in the three land grants. He retained only the northernmost part of the 1749 grant where the home place was located. William married Tabitha King, who was a widow with a daughter also named Tabitha. (Some researchers believe William had a wife between Reliance and Tabitha). William died in 1774 and his will was probated in the County of Bute, Province of North Carolina. Clarence McDaniel, a Paschal researcher for over 30 years writes: "We have traced as accurately as possible the descendants of the eight sons. All eight sons married and had issue. William was blessed with no less than 63 grandchildren!"

My direct line continues with William's son, Thomas, who remained in the Granville/Warren County area of Drewry and Ridgeway. Thomas was probably born about 1755 in Granville County and died December 1821 in Warren County. He married Charity Russell in 1773, Bute County. They had 11 children: Nancy, William, Thomas, Mary, John, Elizabeth, Henry, Michael Wood, Robert D., Bushby/Bushaba, and Martha A.

In the next generation, Thomas' son, Thomas, Jr., was born about 1775 and married Sally Mabry 1798 in Warren County. Land was deeded to Thomas, Jr., in Smith Creek Township. Thomas and Sally had the following children listed in his will: Luke, Henry, Letitia, Joshua, Sarah L., and Hester Ann. Thomas died in 1844 in Warren County, North Carolina. His will was proved in Warren County Court May 1846. He willed land to his daughter, Hester Paschall (wife of Michael W. Paschall, Jr.) and daughter, Letitia Duke (wife of William G. Duke). Joshua inherited other items. Luke's children were listed in the will (William, James, Richard, Cornelia, Winnifred, and Alfred). Luke apparently died prior to 1844.

Hester Ann Paschall was born in 1820. She married Michael Wood Paschall, Jr. in 1835 in Warren County. Michael was born in 1815, the son of Michael Wood Paschall and Elizabeth Wood. Children of Hester and Michael were: Robert H.M., born 1838, M. Elizabeth, born 1841, L., born 1842, Charity W., born 1843: and Lucy N., born 20 August 1835 - my great grandmother. Hester died after 1860 and Michael died after 1870. Lucy N. married Robert William Paschall on 21 April 1852 in Warren County. Robert William, born July 1825, was the son of William Paschall and Martha R. (Wilson?). They lived and farmed the land of their ancestors in the Nutbush Township, near Exchange (Drewry), North Carolina.

Lucy was known by her family as "Mammy Lucy" and Robert as "Grandpa Bob". Several children and grandchildren lived in the area of the home place and farmed tobacco. The Paschall Family Cemetery was near the home and also located nearby was Paschall's Grist Mill. A tradition of family gatherings began in 1905 as shown in old photographs. We don't know how many years this continued but there was a lapse of years until July 4, 1931 when the reunions began taking place again. This time it was at the home of Robert H. and Tempe W. Paschall's home near Drewry. Robert was a grandson of Robert W. and Lucy. Paschall

families and friends still gather at Drewry for a wonderful dinner and fellowship always on the 4th of July. The only time it changes would be if the 4th fell on a Sunday. This became the rule when several Paschalls were ministers and would have to be in their church on Sundays. These reunions honor the memory of the deceased relatives, and honor the achievements, family togetherness, sharing love and sharing the Christian faith. Robert died January 1908 and Lucy April 1918 in Warren County.

Children of Lucy and Robert were Catherine William (1853-1953) married Weldon E. Capps (1851-?) had eight children; Mary Anderson (1856-1915); Hester Ann (1858-1863); Michael Thomas (1861-1863); Magie Jane (1866-1866); Robert David (1868-1930) married Willie G. Duke (1868-1941) had one child; Nicholas Harris (1870-1954) married Lottie L. Stone (1873-1973) had six children; Hattie James (1871-after 1934) married Samuel Johnston, had three children; Asa Paul (1876-1950) married Irene Cole Mustain (1881-1943) had three children; Lucy Elizabeth (1878-1925) married Hugh William Paschall (1875-1940) had eight children; Martha Richard (1880-1935) married James W. Hicks (1874-1929) had ten children.

Many descendants of these families have continued to live and prosper in Warren County and surrounding areas in North Carolina. You will find descendants of William Paschall of the land grants throughout the United States.

Richard Peed and Malinda Tilley Peed

The search for my great-great-grandparents ended in the winter of 2001. Richard Peed (b. 1814, d. 1896) and Malinda (Tilley) Peed (b. 1821, d. 1886) were laid to rest in the Peed family cemetery near their Knap of Reed's homestead in Granville County. A reminder of this husband/father inscribed on the tall granite tombstone reads, "Gone but not forgotten." This God-fearing couple attended the Knap of Reeds Baptist Church where Richard was a clerk for 15 years. The church stood where the dairy farm now resides on old Highway 75. Because of his convictions, Richard joined the Round Hill Temperance Society of Orange County and was appointed as a delegate to the Temperance Convention in Hillsborough, NC (1845).

Richard Peed (a farmer) was the first of four sons born to Thomas Peed (son of Lewis Peed) and Elizabeth Shearman/Sherman (daughter of Mishel Shearman) who resided in the Tar River vicinity. The other sons were John (b. 1816), Sherman (b. 1819) and Dudley (b. 1825).

Malinda Tilley Peed, daughter of Edmund Tilley and Kesiah Moize, bore six children. They were: (1) William "Buck" (b. 1840, d. 1878) who married "Jennie" Waller and Fanny Cozart, served as a Confederate soldier (pictured as such in the Peed photo album) and was a Knap of Reeds merchant; (2) Rutha Jane (b. 1843) who married "Doc" Waller and soon thereafter moved to Arkansas; (3) Rufus (b. 1847, d. 1880) who married Martha Bowling; (4) Charles Alsa - my ancestral lineage (b. 1850, d. 1930) who married Lucy Lunsford (b. 1854, d. 1921) and was also a clerk for Knap of Reeds Church for 17 years; (5) Hugh (b. 1857, d. 1865); and (6) Angie (b. 1861, d. 1925) who married Frank Kelley and made their home at the old home place (pictured in Ben Patrick's "GranDurSon") built by her father, Richard. My grandmother, Ruth Alfred Utley still recalls visiting her Aunt "Ang" in Knap of Reeds as a child. It was a "long" journey from Durham to Knap of Reeds in those days: all via dirt roads.

My great-great-grandparents, Charles Alsa Peed (buried in Peed Cemetery) and Lucy Lunsford Peed (buried in Durham's Maplewood Cemetery) had ten children and moved to Durham when my great

grandmother, La Cenie, was ten years old. Lucy was the daughter of Joseph Lunsford and Edney Fowler (daughter of Moody Fowler). The children of Charles Alsa and Lucy were: (1) Nora (b. 1871) who married W.R. Dupree; (2) Hugh (b. 1874, d. 1888); (3) Maude (b. 1877, d. 1932); (4) Joseph (b. 1879) who married Pearl Wilson; (5) La Cenie Jane - my ancestral lineage (b. 1881, d. 1956) who married Thomas Herndon Alford in 1900; (6) Carl Alsa (b. 1884) who married Lessie Lee; (7) Nannie (b. 1886); (8) Clyde (b. 1889, d. 1892); (9) Kenneth (b. 1891, d. 1892); and (10) Beulah (b. 1895, d. 1986). I remember my great grandmother, "Cenie Mama", and my great aunts Nannie and Beulah with great fondness. La Cenie and Thomas H. Alford are buried in Durham's Maplewood Cemetery.

In the early 20th century my great grandparents, La Cenie Peed Alford and Thomas H. Alford, owned a big white house on East Main Street in Durham. Each room had a marble fireplace and a couple of rooms upstairs had balconies; the house even had indoor toilets.

Thomas ran a general store that literally stocked everything imaginable. To this day, my grandmother, "Ma Ruth", talks about this store; how the banana bunches hung from hooks, the huge cash register standing near the door, the tall ladder that ran along the wall, the big glass display windows and especially how she could "take" candy whenever she wanted. She also told me an unbelievable story about their two horses, Charlie and George. Charlie could open the barn door and proceed to turn the water on for George and himself. Unfortunately, he couldn't turn the water off...

There were eleven children born to La Cenie and Thomas. They were: (1) Ralph J. (b. 1902, d. 1973) who became a physician and moved to Kentucky; (2) Thomas H. Alford (b. 1903); (3) Bernice L. (b. 1905, d. 1968); (4) Kenith (b. 1907, d. 1908) who died as an infant; (5) Ruth Holt - my ancestral lineage (b. 1909) who married Lewis Henry Utley (b. 1906, d. 1997) in 1930; (6) Forrest "Buck" (b. 1910) who married Sarah Edwards; (7) William D. (b. 1921); (8) Lucy E. (b. 1915) who married Cecil Jackson and moved to Tarboro, NC; (9) Mary V. (b. 1916) who married Ben Witt and moved to Tennessee; (10) Nellie Ross (b. 1920) who married and also moved to Tennessee; and (11) Oscar Haywood (b. 1922) who joined the U.S. Marine Corp., married and moved to California. These great-aunts and uncles have been very dear to me over the years and I will treasure every memory throughout my life.

My grandparents, Ruth Alford and Lewis Henry Utley married in 1930. They had three children: (1) Shirley Louise - my ancestral lineage (b. 1931) who married Otho Lee Hursey; (2) Carolyn Ann (b. 1939) who married Hazel Baker; and (3) Lewis Steve (b. 1945) who married Gwen Upchurch. My grandfather ("Pa Lou") ran Lewis' Café with the assistance of my grandmother ("Ma Ruth") on W. Main Street in Durham until 1981 when Bright Leaf Developers bought his property.

My parents, Shirley Utley and Otho Lee Hursey (b. 1929) were married in 1948. They had three children: (1) Sherry Donna (b. 1949) who married David Lee Handfinger; (2) Don Allen (b. 1952) who married Donna Hinsdale; and (3) Van Kent (b. 1958) who married Pam Wilkerson.

My children's names are (1) Tiffany Dawn (b. 1980) and (2) Tyler Alford (b. 1989).

Dudley Snead Gooch 1804 – 1863

Dudley Snead Gooch is the son of Daniel Gooch and his wife Nancy Sneed. Dudley was born on the 1st of August 1804 in Granville and died on the 12th of March 1863 in Nash County. He is buried in the Gooch graveyard near Enon Church. As a young adult, Dudley farmed part of his father's plantation located on Fox Creek with three slaves. Through inheritance and purchases, Dudley acquired 836 acres of land in the Goshen District neighboring the Thorpe Family, which he farmed with an enslaved labor force of around twelve people. Dudley sold this land in 1859 to Joseph Morton and purchased 590 acres of land on the Tar River near Spring Hope in the Manning District of Nash County. Local Nash County historian, Mrs. Anne Brantley recalled that the Gooch house was a two-story clapboard with a small front porch and a large separate kitchen with sleeping quarters; the house burned down early in the 20th century. From his probate records, Dudley was involved in limber milling as well as raising the typical cash crops of cotton and tobacco.

Dudley married twice. A bond dated the 26th of January in 1837 records his first marriage to Mary Jane Bennett; the bondsman was Brigadier General William S. McClanahan of Oxford. Mary Jane Bennett was called "Polly" and is the daughter of Charles L. Bennett and his wife Martha Walker.

Dudley married secondly Mary I. Jones "Indianna"; their marriage bond is dated 30th of December 1851 in Granville County. Mary is the daughter of William "Buck" Jones and his wife Nancy Ragland. She is found enumerated in the Gooch household before her marriage in 1850, as she was working for Dudley as a governess for his orphaned children. Thirty years Dudley's junior, her presence and authority in the household was resented by her stepchildren. Mary died not long after giving birth to her second child. Her obituary published in "The Biblical Reporter" states, "She was a member of the Baptist Church. She was perfectly resigned to death, called her friends and relations around her dying bed and bid them adieu. She was beloved and respected by all who knew her."

Dudley's children by Polly Bennett are: Richard born 18th of August 1839 and died 28th of May 1842, followed by his brother William Brittle born 22nd of October 1836 and died 20th of June 1842. According to the family Bible, both died of dysentery.

Martha Jane "Mattie" was born 1st of July 1837 and died 10th of January 1922. Mattie married Martin Luther Pitts (1846-1901) the son of Walter Pitts and his wife Martha Mitchell. Mattie raised a large family on a farm near Banks Chapel. The Pitts children are Franklin Luther; Lizzie Mae; George Oliver; Mary Cornelia; Arthur Dudley; Annie Julia; Benjamin Rowland; Martha Lily; and William Needham.

Samuel Iredell was born 7th of March 1841 and died in Durham, NC on 10th of February 1922. Samuel served in the Confederate Navy, and a letter written from the ship "The Indian Chief" survives. Samuel married in 1868 to Sallie the daughter of William Gill Thomas and Susan Lewis. Samuel and Sally had three children: Eugene Theodore, Emma and Willie. Eugene married his first cousin Leona Gooch and is believed to have had sons Eugene and Albert. Emma married businessman and aviator Samuel B. Markley and lived in Beaver, Pennsylvania and Sebring, Florida. William "Willie" was a postman in Durham.

Joseph S. was born 13th of November 1842 and died in 1919 in Granville County. In 1866, Joseph married Sallie, the daughter of Nash County planter Matthew Wilder and his wife Martha Avery. Joseph Gooch settled on a farm near Wilton where he also ran a store. He and his wife had issue: Carey E.; Nobia; James;

Edward Norton; Joseph; and William.

Anne Sneed "Annie" was born 8th of March and died 13th of February 1923 in Tyler, Smith County, Texas. In 1867, Annie married Benjamin Wood Rowland (1845-1921) of Granville County; Benjamin is the son of Horace H. Rowland and his wife Martha Cheatham. Ben Rowland was a druggist and moved out to East Texas with his brother Horace to establish banking and mercantile businesses in Tyler. The Rowland children are: Ida Corinna married Charles Baldwin; Lille Cornelia married George Gooch; Meta Julia who never married; Benjamin Dudley married Cynthia Kennemur; Carrie married Thomas E. Swann; and Ernest (1880-1882).

Julia Lemay was born 7th (or 11th) of December 1845 and died 23rd of April 1932. She spent her early years with her unmarried aunt and uncle, Hannah and Amos Gooch on the old Gooch home place in Granville County. Julia became a Presbyterian and was a long time member of Geneva Presbyterian Church. She married late in life in 1884 to tobacco merchant and farmer John Henry Meadows (1847-1901); it was his second marriage and they did not have children. John is the son of Pinkney Meadows and his wife Rowan Shearman.

Cornelia Pannill "Neal" was born 12th of September 1847 and died 21st of August 1930 in Oxford, NC. In 1866, Cornelia married tobacco merchant and entrepreneur James Madison Currin "Mat." James Madison (1846-1911) is the son of William A. Currin and his wife Lucy Hobgood. Mat Currin served in the Confederate Navy and after the War was involved with the American Tobacco Company. He served as Oxford town commissioner; was a Mason; and a Baptist. The Currins built a large elegant Queen Anne style house on High Street. The Currin children are: Eugene married Alice Louise Randolph; William Dudley "Buck" (1869-1936); Eva C. (1871-1904) married John Bailey Owens, President of the Citizens Bank & Trust and associated with the Henderson Telephone Company and Henderson & Harriet Cotton Mill; Louise "Lornie" married Rev. William Cornelius Tyree of Virginia; Mary (1878-1903); Nelle married Oxford banker and merchant, Alexander Hamilton Powell; Margaret married Robert Gilliam Lassiter, President of the R&G Railroad.

Dudley Snead Jr. was born on 24th of November 1848 and died 7th February 1928 near Norlina in Warren County. Dudley S. Gooch Jr. married twice. His first wife Elizabeth "Lizzie" is the daughter of Walter Bullock and his wife Mary Elizabeth Parrish. Lizzie was born 24th of November 1854 and died 07th of June 1889. By Lizzie, Dudley had issue: Hannah Bell (1871-1937) married Walter Long; Benjamin Walter Gooch (1872-1909); Thomas Dudley married Blanche Mahanna; Mary Dow married Oliver Kimball; Leona Daisy (1878-1940) married her first cousin Eugene T. Gooch; Zorah Blanche married Walter Harris; Sallie Elizabeth married Walter Boyd; Nancy Etta married John Brummitt; and sons Joseph Mabrey and Richard Venable who were both struck by lightning in 1898. Dudley married secondly Nancy Parthenia Hobgood (1865-1935) affectionately known as Aunt "Mit." Nancy is the daughter of Presley B. Hobgood and his wife Sarah Elizabeth Terry. By Nancy, Dudley had issue: Alpha Presley married Maggie Mustain; Julia E. married first Ed Collins and secondly Cary Gallion; William Terry Gooch; Amos Dorsey Gooch; Susie Sneed married William H. Faucette; Arthur Francis married Annie Hart; and Oza Omega Gooch.

Dudley's children by Mary "Indianna" Jones are William Daniel, also known as "Pomp," born 5th October in 1851 and died on the 4th April 1892. William settled in Texas. William married Sarah Louretta Susan Fulton on the 19th of February 1879 and had issue: Charles Thomas; William Daniel; Jesse Fulton; Loretta; and Eva.

Thomas was born on 15th of May probably in the year 1853 and died on 10th of March 1919 in Baltimore, Maryland. Thomas went into the mercantile business. He established himself in Baltimore, Maryland where he purchased a farm and large colonial house in Reisertown, Maryland. Thomas married Dora Mae, the daughter of Dr. William S. Edwards and his wife Elizabeth Marley of Siler City, North Carolina. Thomas

and Dora had two daughters, Iantha and Helen. Widowed in 1919, Dora moved her daughters to Hollywood, California where she died in 1926.

Corn Family of Granville County

Matthew and Molly Corn immigrated to the colony of Virginia in early 1700 from Germany. Their son, John Peter Corn, my ancestor, was born March 15, 1752 in Albermarle County, Virginia and died Oct. 14, 1843 and is buried at the Ebenezer Church Cemetery in Henderson County, NC. On Feb. 8, 1776, at age 24, John Peter enlisted in Washington's Army serving in Capt. Jouett's Company, Colonel Dangerfield's 7th Virginia Regiment. John Peter was wounded in a skirmish with the British Guard near Philadelphia and suffered during winter quarters at Valley Forge Camp in 1777. May 24, 1781, John Peter married Hannah Elizabeth Parr (b June 14, 1764) of Henry County, Virginia. In 1794, John Peter and Elizabeth began migrating from Henry County, VA through Surry and Wilkes Counties, NC and finally settled in Henderson County, NC. They reared a family of 15 children. Noah Parr (b Jan 25, 1802 d Oct. 9, 1874) was my great-great grandfather. John Peter is honored as a Revolutionary War soldier on a monument located at the old Henderson County Courthouse, Hendersonville, NC. He has a DAR gravestone recognizing his service during the War of Independence.

It has been said that the family of John Peter Corn furnished western North Carolina with more pioneer Baptist ministers than any other known in the annals of the denomination. "Two of the outstanding characteristics of this family were their simple faith and unyielding principles. Devout men of strong convictions who did outstanding work among the Cherokee Indians, traveling by foot and horseback over the rough and rugged mountains of western North Carolina and North Georgia."

Rev. Noah Parr Corn married Elizabeth Capps about 1824 (b Nov. 19, 1798 d. Mar. 2, 1872). The couple had eight children: Adam Jefferson (b 1827 d July 18, 1900); George Washington (b 1829); Ezekiel W. (b 1830 d 1865); Jesse M. (b 1831); Robert Arretus (b Jan. 8, 1833); Daniel E. (b 1838); Benjamin Franklin (b 1839); and Noah Parr Middleton (b Dec 5, 1845 d Mar. 23, 1919).

Rev. Noah Parr Middleton Corn, the eighth son of Rev. Noah Parr Corn was my great-grandfather. He was married Sept. 30, 1866 to Elicia Ellen Fletcher (b Jul 27, 1848 d Mar. 24, 1936) of Fletcher, NC, daughter of James and Delicia (Jones) Fletcher. His brother, the Rev. Adam Jefferson Corn performed the wedding ceremony. Noah Parr Middleton served as "drummer boy" with Company K, 50th Regiment, J.B. Palmer's Brigade, NC State Troops, CSA during the Civil War, enlisting Dec. 5, 1864. Noah and Elisha had ten children: George Washington (b Dec 5, 1868 d Feb. 10, 1939); Delicia Elizabeth (July 27, 1870); Stimpson Alexander (b May 25, 1872); Elijah Adam (b 1875); James Augustus (b April 30, 1877), Jesse Wallin (b May 17, 1879 d June 23, 1960); Daniel King (b May 18810); Elbert (b May 15, 1883 d Sept. 12, 1959); Lillie Mae (b Sept. 16, 1886 d Mar. 21, 1954); and Paul Spurgeon (b Aug. 19, 1889). Four of these sons were preachers.

Rev. Jesse Wallin Corn was my grandfather. He married Martha Elizabeth Hensley in 1899 (b May 8, 1881 d Dec. 9, 1964). They had eight children: Theodore Wesley married Annie Mae Allen; Riley Marion (b 1906 d July 2, 1968) married Bessie Wilson; Clare (died as infant); Fluvial Howard (b June 3, 1908 d Sept. 18, 1987) married Gertrude Bradley Dec 23, 1934 (b June 25, 1910 d Dec. 23, 1981); James Wilton (b July 17, 1910 d April 10, 1990) married Opal Huntsinger; Lillian Beatrice (b Oct. 29, 1912) married Earl Brady; Ellard Montgomery (b July 27, 1914 d Aug. 26, 1984); Pauline married Lawrence Herron.

Flavel Howard Corn was my father and Gertrude G. Bradley (descendant of John Bradley -Granville/Bute County pioneer family), my mother. As "Coach Kuykendall's flashy fullback" Flavel was an outstanding football player for Mars Hill High School in 1928 and 1929. He received a scholarship to play football at Forman University in 1930. Gertrude studied teacher education at Mars Hill College and Appalachian State Teacher's College at Boone. They had three daughters: Martha Elizabeth (Feb. 10, 1937) married Olin Clark Aug. 25, 1958; Emily Gertrude (b July 5, 1943) married Dallas Herbert Champion July 26, 1969, (descendant of two Granville County pioneer families -John H. Boyd and Walter C. Champion); and Ann Bradley (b Nov 23, 1944) married Phillip Hazen Briggs April 17, 1965. Martha, Emily and Ann attended Mars Hill College with Emily completing graduate studies in teacher education at North Carolina Central University in Durham.

Martha and Olin Clark have three children: James Howard (b Dec. 3. 1959) married (1) Luanne Bolling Aug. 9, 1985 (2) Trisha Crawford; Lisa Anne (b Nov. 22, 1964) married Thomas Davis June 10, 1984; and Karen Elizabeth (b Feb. 12, 1968) married David Dumers Jan 23, 1988.

Emily and Dallas Champion have one child: Leigh Anne (b April 12, 1970) married (1) Marty Goss Sept 17, 1988 (descendant of Granville pioneer family -Thomas Goss. Sr.) (2) Van Hughes April 27, 1994. Ann and Phillip Briggs have two children: Scott Phillip (b Jan. 1, 1974) married Nika Alexander; Steven Garrison (b April 18, 1976) married Maneeka McHone.

James and Luanne Clark have two sons: Taylor James (b April 18, 1989) and Zachary Hampton (b Aug. 1, 1994). James and Trisha Clark have a daughter: Samantha (b Dec. 2001). Lisa and Thomas Davis have a daughter: Courtney Talia (b Aug. 13, 1984). Karen and David Dumers have two children: Amanda Elizabeth (b June 9, 1989) and Kyle Jacob (b Dec 23, 1990).

Leigh Anne and Marty Goss have a daughter: Kara Leigh (b June 23, 1991). Leigh Anne and Van Hughes have two children: Victoria Anne (b Nov. 23, 1994) and Dylan Thomas (b Feb. 1, 1996). Scott and Nika Briggs have two children: Olivia Nicole (b Feb 2, 2000) and Aaron Tyler (b June 12, 2001).

Steven and Maneeka Briggs have one child: Tristen Hazen (b March 3, 1998).

Elijah Evans Averett was born to Henry and Wilmouth Averett in 1784. He was one of eleven children and the first Averett to come to Granville County. He married Delia Crew in Charles City County, VA in June 1809. They had four children. Their first son was Henry Averett born in VA 1810. He married Missouri in November 1835. A daughter, Sarah was born January 1816 in North Carolina. Another son, Joel was born in 1826 in North Carolina and married Julia Ann Williams in January 1852. The last son was Thomas R. born in 1826. It is believed that Joel and Thomas were twins. Thomas married Martha Wright in October 1850.

The Averetts were said to have owned land and were tillers of the soil.

Joel and Julia Ann Averett had six children: Charlie, David Cameron, Plummer, Ada, Meta and Emma. Ada

and Meta both married Mize's and moved to Oklahoma. Emma married A. M. Overton. Plummer married _____ and Charlie married _____.

David Cameron Averett married Annie Hester, daughter of Mary Cordelia and Francis Hester from the Corinth community. David and Annie had three children: Pearl, Ewell, Buxton (Buck), and Frank Hester Averett. Pearl married S. K. Long from Person County. They had two daughters. Earle and Maxine. Earle married Ernest Barrett from eastern Carolina. They had one daughter, Julia Brent Barrett. Julia Brent married Arnom Harris from Henderson, NC. They have two children: Tray and Anna Lee. They live in Springfield, Virginia. Arnom is a retired army officer.

Maxine Long married Willie Francis Schmit, known as "Smitty". He was in service during World War II. They had three children: Vera Ann, Frank, and Frances. Vera Ann married Leonard Creech and had two children: Pam and Mike. Pam married Jeff Siffert from South Boston, VA. They have two daughters: Courtney and Tiffany. Mike married Amy Benston from Columbia, SC. They have one daughter: Madison. Vera Ann was divorced and married James Burnette. They live on Highway 158 west of Oxford.

Frank Schmit built on the family farm across from Corinth Church. He first married Ella Keith, divorced and later married Dottie Sparrow. Frank owns Granville Communications in Oxford.

Frances married Jack Howard of Corinth Community. They have two sons: Patrick and Phillip. They moved to Newland, NC where Jack bought a gas company.

Ewell Buxton, son of Annie and David Cameron was born July 1891 on the Averett farm across from Corinth Church. "Buck" lived in Corinth Community all his life. He, as a young man, attended Kings Business College in Raleigh, NC, and he was also a successful framer. He married Ruby Mangum, daughter of Elvis and Etta Harris Mangum of Tar River Station, Granville County. Ruby attended Oxford Seminary. Buck died May 1962. Ruby was born September 1896 and died July 1976. They had one son, Elvis Buxton, known as E. B. Averett, born September 30, 1922. E. B. attended Wilton High School and Louisburg College. After that he was called into the army to serve in World War II. He served in five campaigns in Europe: 1st Normandy, 2nd Northern France, 3rd Ardeans, 4th Central Germany, 5th Rhinland. After his return from the war, he took over the family farm raising grain, tobacco, corn and other crops. They also had cattle. E. B. married Carrie Frances Watson, daughter of Ernest and Claud Currin Watson. She was a cosmetologist in Granville County and had her shop at home for many years. E. B. and Carrie Frances have two children: Ernest Brent born May 1956, and Frank Cameron born May 1961.

Ernest graduated from South Granville High School, Louisburg College, ECU and went to NC State University to get a Masters degree in Life Science. He taught at Vance Academy, worked in Real Estate and farmed until he took over the family farm, named in the 1980s "Flat Wood Farm". He is married to Phyllis Cash, daughter of the late Carlton Cash and Joyce Johnson of Oxford. Phyllis is a C.C. Nurse and works for Dr. Allen Kindman, a heart physician. They have one son. Charles Buxton Averett born in 1999. They built a home on the farm.

Frank Cameron graduated from South Granville High School. He attended East Carolina and graduated from Vance Granville Community College with a degree in Electronics. He worked at Northern Telecom in Research Triangle for many years. Frank is married to Kathryn Crews from Corinth Community. She is the daughter of the late William Crews and Betty Crews. Kathryn is Register of Deeds in Granville Co. Frank and Kathryn built their home on the Crews farm in Corinth.

Frank Hester Averett, son of David Cameron and Annie Averett was born 1886 and died 1959. He was a soldier in World War I. He married Jessie Chitty from Murfreesboro, NC. They lived next to Corinth Church. They had no children.
